State Goal: To increase student proficiency by %20. This will be done by focusing on using data to drive and inform our instruction in regards to the Utah Core Standards. Specifically writing, reading, comprehension, and vocabulary/phonics skills.

Academic Area: Academic priorities will include but no limited to English/Language arts, math, science, arts, and physical education.

Measurements-what will be used to quantify student academic progress and success. Teachers will use baseline data from the previous year's RISE testing in addition to data collected in the district's SIS Aspire to help determine student master at any given time. Acadience Reading data will be used to form the baseline measurement for each student.

Action Plan expenditures: 1. Retention of and additional training and support for our paraprofessionals. 2. Purchasing resources to help with reading and comprehension skills. 3. Training opportunities will be provided for faculty and staff. 4. Using various math, science, and ELA software teachers will be able to monitor students' understanding of Utah Core Standards. 5. Teachers will be once each quarter with administrator sped teachers, and Title I teachers to discuss progress and needs of each student. (T.E.S.S. meetings).
